MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Music Scholarships are available for girls entering Year 7 or Year 8, and are awarded on musical excellence.

The Music Scholarship applicant must sit an Academic scholarship exam, for which there is a fee, as a pre-requisite to being considered for a Music Scholarship. Our scholarship examinations are administered by the Academic Assessment Services.

The Ohman Music Scholarship provides 75 per cent remission of academic tuition fees and 100 per cent of music tuition on one instrument (60 minutes per week) for the duration of Middle and Senior Years (subject to means testing).

The Council Music Scholarship provides 50 per cent remission of academic tuition fees and 100 per cent of music tuition on one instrument (60 minutes per week) for the duration of Middle and Senior Years.

Scholarship holders are required to make a leading contribution to the life of music in the College by enrolling in class music and/or performing in College ensembles.

Recipients are expected to maintain a high level of achievement in their chosen area of music study and be fully supportive of, and contribute to, the musical life of the College.

Any combination of instruments may be offered. Students should be approximately AMEB Grade IV standard, or above, on their principal instrument.

There is an expectation that the scholarship holders will select the Music Course of Study in Years 11 and 12. A successful candidate on pianoforte may continue to learn pianoforte as her principal instrument, but will also be required to learn an orchestral or band instrument. Scholarship holders are expected to participate in at least 2 College ensembles

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS

Candidates are required to perform two contrasting pieces on their principal instrument and, if applicable, one piece on a second instrument. There will also be aural tests, sight reading and a short informal interview.

MUSIC PRIZES

Prizes and Awards available annually to enrolled students (this includes students who are enrolled for the following year but not yet at MLC):

APPLICATIONS OPEN IN 2015 FOR 2016.

10 x Year 6 Instrumental Prizes: Each provides 50 per cent of the cost of instrumental tuition on an orchestral or band instrument for 32 lessons and the free use of a College instrument, subject to availability. Recipients must participate in at least one College co-curricular ensemble.

15 x Year 7 and 8 Instrumental Prizes: Each provides 50 per cent of the cost of instrumental tuition on an orchestral or band instrument for 32 lessons and the free use of a College instrument, subject to availability. Recipients are required to enroll in Class Music and participate in a minimum of two co-curricular music ensembles.

12 x Year 9 and 10 Vocal and Instrumental Music Prizes: Each provides 50 per cent of the cost of vocal or instrumental tuition for 32 lessons. Recipients are required to enroll in Class Music and are expected to participate in a minimum of two co-curricular music ensembles.

1 x Friends of Music MLC Award: This is awarded to a Year 11 student who is enrolled in Class Music. It provides 50 per cent of the cost of instrumental tuition on one instrument for 32 lessons for Years 11 and 12, and free use of a College instrument,

subject to availability. Recipients are required to participate in a minimum of two co-curricular music ensembles. Students will not normally be awarded an instrumental/vocal prize more than twice during their time at MLC. This condition does not apply to any of the above prizes in any combination with:
